Peter P. Greaney, M.D., is the Medical Director, President and C.E.O. of WorkCare, Inc., based in Anaheim, CA. Dr. Greaney is board-certified in occupational medicine and a specialist in toxicology. An experienced medical practitioner, he is well-versed in work-related injury and illness prevention and management. He attended medical school in Ireland and trained in occupational medicine at the University of California, Irvine, where he is a faculty member. He successfully operated his own occupational health clinic in Southern California, and in response to requests from employers, established WorkCare as a national medical consulting practice in 1984. He serves as an adviser and consulting corporate medical director in industries including public entities, utilities, biotechnology, chemical, oil and gas, major wholesale, manufacturing, engineering, geotechnical and hazardous materials. Dr. Greaney oversees WorkCare's team of Associate Medical Directors and allied subject matter experts. He travels widely and speaks frequently at industry conferences.

Avoiding 10 Common Pitfalls in Work-Related Injury Management
